Erickson Aircraft Collection's ME-109 Visits The DTAM











For a few weeks in June and July, the DTAM welcomed the Erickson Aircraft Collection's ME-109. The aircraft is based out of Madras, Oregon but was in North Dakota for the Grand Forks Air Show in June. This 109 is restored as German ace Hermann Graf's tulip-nosed "Red Fighters" of JG 50 (Fighter Group 50) based out of Weisbaden-Erbenheim, Germany in late 1943. Graf served on both the Eastern and Western Fronts during World War II becoming the first pilot in aviation history to claim 200 aerial victories. He flew about 830 combat missions during the war, claiming a total of 212 aerial victories, most of which were on the Eastern Front.

Recent Acquisitions

In early July, the DTAM accepted delivery of a UH-1H Huey Helicopter. The Huey is an aircraft the museum has been trying to acquire for some time. DTAM acquired this one from HeliTex Properties, Ltd. of Cleburne, Texas. It was transported here via truck and lifted off the truck by Borsheim Crane Services. It is now on display in the Flying Legends Hangar as an interactive exhibit that museum patrons can actually go inside of and sit in the pilot or co-pilot seats, the two gunner seats, or passenger seats. We would like to extend our gratitude to Darrel Kerzmann, Larry Linrud, Warren Pietsch, Tim Lett, Brian Sturm, Don Larson, Dave Smith, and Arvid Pomeroy for assisting in unloading and getting the Huey ready for display.
