P-47D-23RA 42-27609 Takes to the Skies for the First Time in Nearly 80 Years!



A major milestone was reached in May in the restoration of the P-47 Thunderbolt. For the first time in nearly 80 years, this Thunderbolt graced the skies with a nearly flawless series of test flights. After its test flights, the aircraft was flown to Casselton, North Dakota to be painted. The scheme that was chosen is that of Maj. Bill Dunham's "Bonnie" from the PTO.
